



Writing for emagazine – teachers & academics

We're always keen to get new writers for the magazine. Here's what you need to do if you want to submit an article to us.

1. **Make sure you are familiar with the type of article we publish in the magazine.** Although we do publish some general pieces, lack of space means we have to focus on the texts and topics set in the different specifications.
2. **Next email [Barbara Bleiman](#) with your ideas** – a brief outline explaining the text or topic, plus the angle you plan to take is all we need.

We aim to reply to all suggestions within two weeks – it might be a bit longer in the holidays. If we like the sound of your proposed article we'll talk to you about which deadline you might aim for.

Although we only decide on the contents of the next issue after the deadline, please feel free to send your article as soon as it is ready.

3. Articles should be between 1000 and 1500 words and **written for students not teachers.**
4. **Try to be engaging, accessible and lively**, rather than overly academic, but do feel free to challenge students with intellectually demanding ideas or interesting angles.
5. **If you need to include any text or image which is still in copyright**, please let us know before beginning to write and please make sure all quotations have been checked against the original.
6. We're always happy to hear your ideas about how your article might be illustrated but cannot promise to meet all your requirements.
7. Unless otherwise negotiated, copyright remains with *emagazine* for the year following publication. After this time, permission to reproduce the article should be sent with full details of its usage to [Lucy Webster](#). You will then be sent details of the acknowledgement line that must be included.
8. Email articles to [Barbara Bleiman](#). We are sorry but we can no longer accept handwritten articles.

Fees

The current typical fees for articles from adult writers are:

- £150 for a full article
- £75-100 for a one-page article
- £75 for an item that's only published on the *emagazine* website

And finally: some warnings!

1. We cannot promise to publish an article until we have seen the final piece. EMC reserves the right not to publish articles that are submitted, whether commissioned or unsolicited.
2. We only pay for articles which we publish.
3. Although we try to edit with a light touch, sometimes we need to do a bit more to an article. We will always let you see – and amend – the edited version before we publish it.
4. We expect you not to send your article to other publications until and unless we've contacted you with a refusal.
